Alberta raises the bar on bar safety

New council to coordinate provincial efforts to combat liquor related violence

Edmonton... Creating a safe environment for patrons and staff at bars and nightclubs in Alberta is the goal of the new Alberta Safer Bars Council (ASBC).

The new council will provide input to the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC) on policy development and implementation of best practices to help reduce the number of violent incidents in and around licensed venues.

Members were chosen based on their knowledge of Alberta's liquor industry and the issues surrounding violence in and around licensed premises. The 24 individuals represent police agencies, municipalities, liquor and hospitality industries and several government departments.

"This is a growing concern in our society that government can't solve in isolation," said Fred Lindsay, Solicitor General and Minister of Public Security, responsible for the AGLC. "Everyone has a role to play and I'm pleased to see such a broad range of knowledge, experience and diverse perspectives around the table to address this issue."

Members of the council were appointed by the AGLC and will serve a two-year term.
